TERRA NERA

A pristine patch of land located in Tuscany's Maremma region which extends from the coast of Livorno, through the Province of Grosseto in southern Tuscany and into Lazio over Mediterranean hilly chaparral, ancient maritime pine forests and ample sandy beaches.

Viticulture has contributed to shaping Maremma's landscape since the time of the Etruscans. The Etruscan kingdom that stretched between the rivers Arno and Tiber and reached the apex of its splendor between the 7th and the 4th centuries BC.



French Wine makers learned their skills from the Etruscans whose wine trade was one of the principal incentives to expand their influence in the Mediterranean Sea.

Maremma has now become a symbol of oenological excellence in Tuscany. It is home of Italy's most expensive and sought-after IGT and Super Tuscan wines.

The true treasures of the Maremma region lay in the unique patch of land called *terra nera* which means *black earth*.

GROWN ON A PRISTINE PIECE OF LAND

Nested in a wonderful scenery between hills, forests and the Tyrrhenian Sea, our land gifts us with a unique eco system, which allows us to preserve nature by cultivating our winery in a very ecological way. We keep harmony and balance in this pristine place by leaving large areas of our 250 acres (100 ha) land untouched.

The black color of our soil stems from underlying shale clay sediments which are rare to find in nature. They nourish our grapes with precious minerals, such as salts, iron, and potassium, and contribute to the distinct flavor of our prizewinning wine.

Terra Nera grapes are as spectacular as the landscape surrounding them. They are smaller and darker than commercially grown grapes.

Terra Nera red wines are characterized by a deep, complex, and sustainable body, which dances delicately on the tongue, sparking a natural firework of flavors in the nose and palate to leave a long-lasting impression.



ANDRAEMO impresses with its intriguing play of grape varieties, which is led by fresh Syrah and crowned with Cabernet Sauvignon and Sangiovese. The wooden barrel aging creates a harmonious balance. The color of ANDRAEMO is as dark as the Terra Nera soil.

The bouquet echoes aromas of Amarena cherry, campfire embers, spicy herbs and fine leather. As clear and precise as the scents of this wine delights the nose, these aromas taper off to reveal more savoy notes on the palate. Such as black cherry, fresh herbs, a hint of smoke and cocoa. As graceful and silky as the tannins dress this wine, it seems to float quickly over the palate.

The AURONERA is characterized by its true Tuscan aroma, deep and typical for the region and its persistent body.

AURONERA 2016

Falstaff 06/2023: In the scent: cinnamon and milk chocolate, cocoa bean, elderberry juice, dark cherry and thyme, menthol. In the mouth, a dense, firm tannin puts a lot of pressure on, the wine has a long-lasting plateau phase, which brings tension and concentration together at a high level and indicates very good aging potential. Young blood! And not filling.

AURONERA 2015

Falstaff 02/2021: Roasted new wood, notes of dried meat, thyme and sage, dark chocolate. Powerful in the mouth, with fine, but also structured tannins, dense “warm” and plump, but also with a lot of juiciness and a mineral tint that gives freshness. Very good proportions, excellent aging potential.

AURONERA modern surprises with its complex aroma, led by Cabernet and crowned by Sangiovese and Syrah. Its persistent body, which dances delicately and filigree on the tongue, while a natural firework of aromas ignites in the nose and on the palate, which as such remains in the memory for a long time.

AURONERA 2019

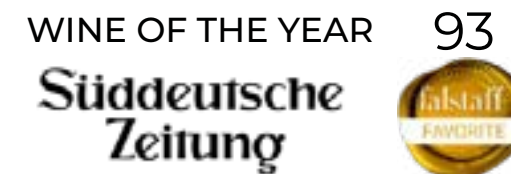
Süddeutsche Zeitung: Connoisseurs and experts from the SZ voted our wine red wine of the year. Its intense aroma is characterized by ripe dark cherries, cassis, campfire embers, noble leather and a cool herbal touch. On the palate, the wine convinces with cherry aromas and mineral depth. Fine smoke and chocolate notes round off the composition. In combination with silky, polished tannins, it seemingly floats across the palate.

AURONERA 2018

Falstaff 07/2021: First blackberry, peppermint, sage, and thyme, then a series of fruity aromas on the palate. Powerful in the mouth with fine, but also structured tannins. The alcohol is present but yields to the refreshing aromas of the fruit.

A pure Tuscan wine. The full-bodied SCORPUS, as pure Sangiovese, convinces every lover of Italian wine art. Sangiovese is considered as Tuscany's signature grape. A lot of the fabled wine region's top vintages come from Sangiovese giving its grapes distinctive character to many famous wines. Terra Nera's most celebrated Sangiovese grapes award our SCORPUS an intriguing rich dark red color and a full body with an appreciable hint of tannins and acidity.

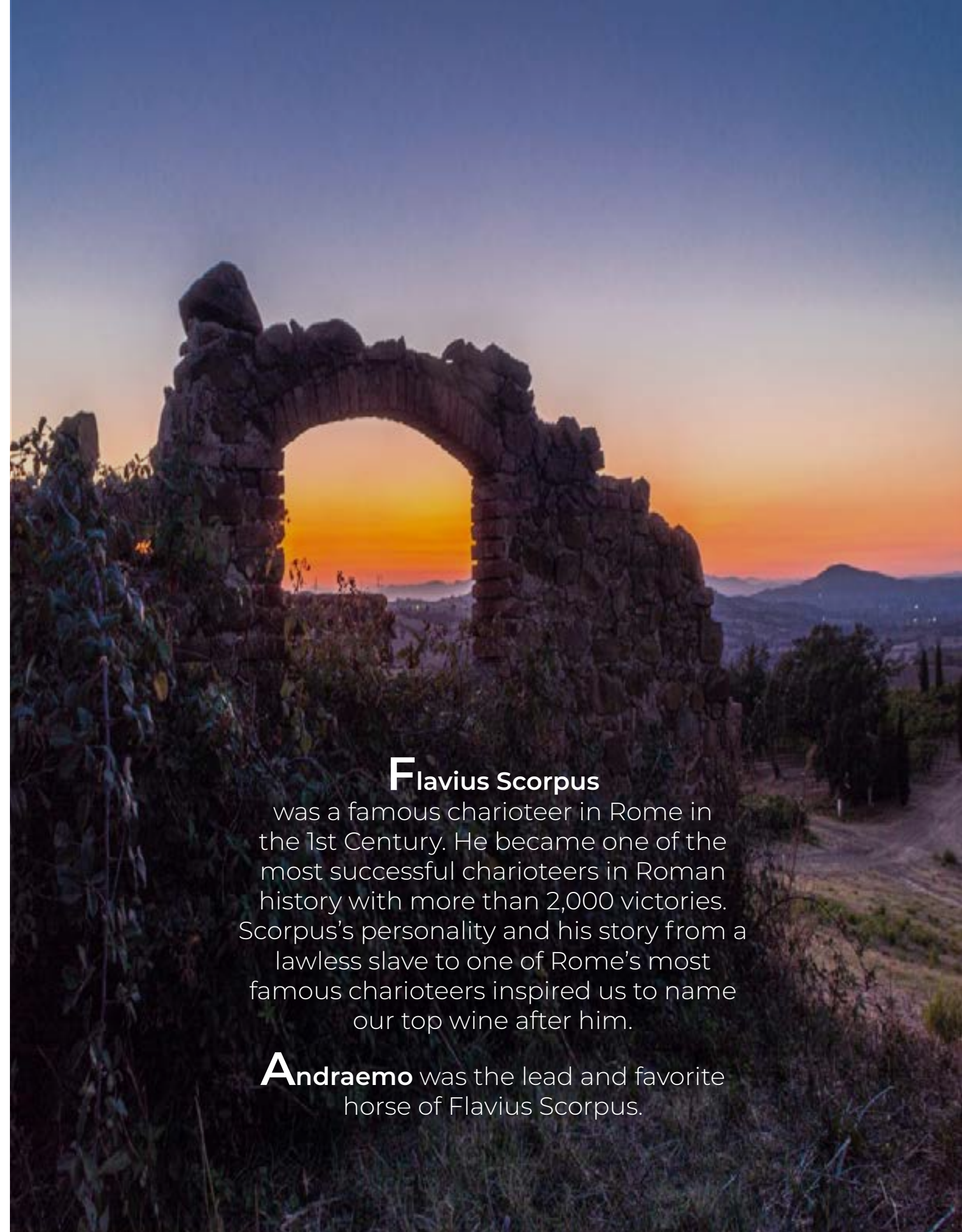
SCORPUS 2016

Falstaff 02/2021: Dark chocolate, cinnamon, clove on the nose. In the mouth plump and soft, very fine, silky tannin in good dose, ripe acidity, a Sangiovese in a Sunday suit, extremely balanced, stylistically, however, more pleasing by fullness and power than by primal wildness.

Flavius Scorpis

was a famous charioteer in Rome in the 1st Century. He became one of the most successful charioteers in Roman history with more than 2,000 victories. Scorpis's personality and his story from a lawless slave to one of Rome's most famous charioteers inspired us to name our top wine after him.

Andraemo was the lead and favorite horse of Flavius Scorpis.

In 1996, I started my venture with the dream of owning my own winery, whose grapes would produce the highest quality red wines.

I was always drawn close to Rome. Here I secretly hoped to find the place I had long been searching for.

A historic winery with a view overlooking the sea, nestled in the most peaceful, unspoiled nature, with grapes that have the potential to write wine history.

When I had my first glass of red wine, from grapes grown on this special piece of land called Terra Nera, I knew at the first drop:

I've arrived!
